**Title: Infectious Diseases: Emergent Infections and Solid Organ Transplant Patients Management**

### **GENERAL DESCRIPTION**

### **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

2. Discuss organ transplant scenarios: pre transplant and post transplant management. We will discuss diagnosis and treatment of infectious diseases in liver and renal transplant setting. Special discussion about prevention of infections in this setting.

3. Discussion of clinical cases at ICU and wards.
